What is the PE and Sports Premium?

The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. The government is spending over £450 million on this funding over the 3 academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016.

PE and Sports Premium 2014/2015 Allocation

The PE and Sports Funding Allocation for 2014/15 is **£8,450**.

PE and Sports Premium Objectives 2014/2015

Objectives in spending the PE and Sports Funding Premium:

1. To establish a professional development programme to upskill teachers and teaching assistants in achieving high quality Physical Education throughout school.
2. To increase the participation in PE and Sports through providing high quality extra- curricular activities.
3. To invest in new Sports equipment and resources to maximise the opportunities for physical activity throughout the school.

Objective 2: Actions Increase participation in PE and Sports. Increased participation from parents through the home activity booklets and challenge checks.
