

We currently have a vacancy for a Lunchtime Supervisor starting after the Easter holiday. The hours are 6.25 per week from 11.50am to 1.05pm Monday to Friday. 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### Security issues and accessing school

The front pedestrian gate will be locked when the children are outside for playtimes (10.30 to 11am and 11.55 to 1pm), or if children are outside for other activities during school time. Anyone requiring access will need to telephone school to request access, or avoid these times.

The rear pedestrian gate is locked from 9.15am to 2.45pm. This gate is unlocked and manned between 11.40 and 11.50am and 12.10 to 12.20pm for nursery parents to pick up and drop off children.

Any pupils arriving late to main school (after 9.00am) need to come to the main school office where the accompanying adult/carer will be required to fill in the 'late register', and any children arriving after 9.10am will receive an 'unauthorised absence' mark for that morning.

**Absence Reporting:** If your child is absent due to illness, hospital appointment, etc. it is important that you inform school the reason for the absence as soon as possible.
